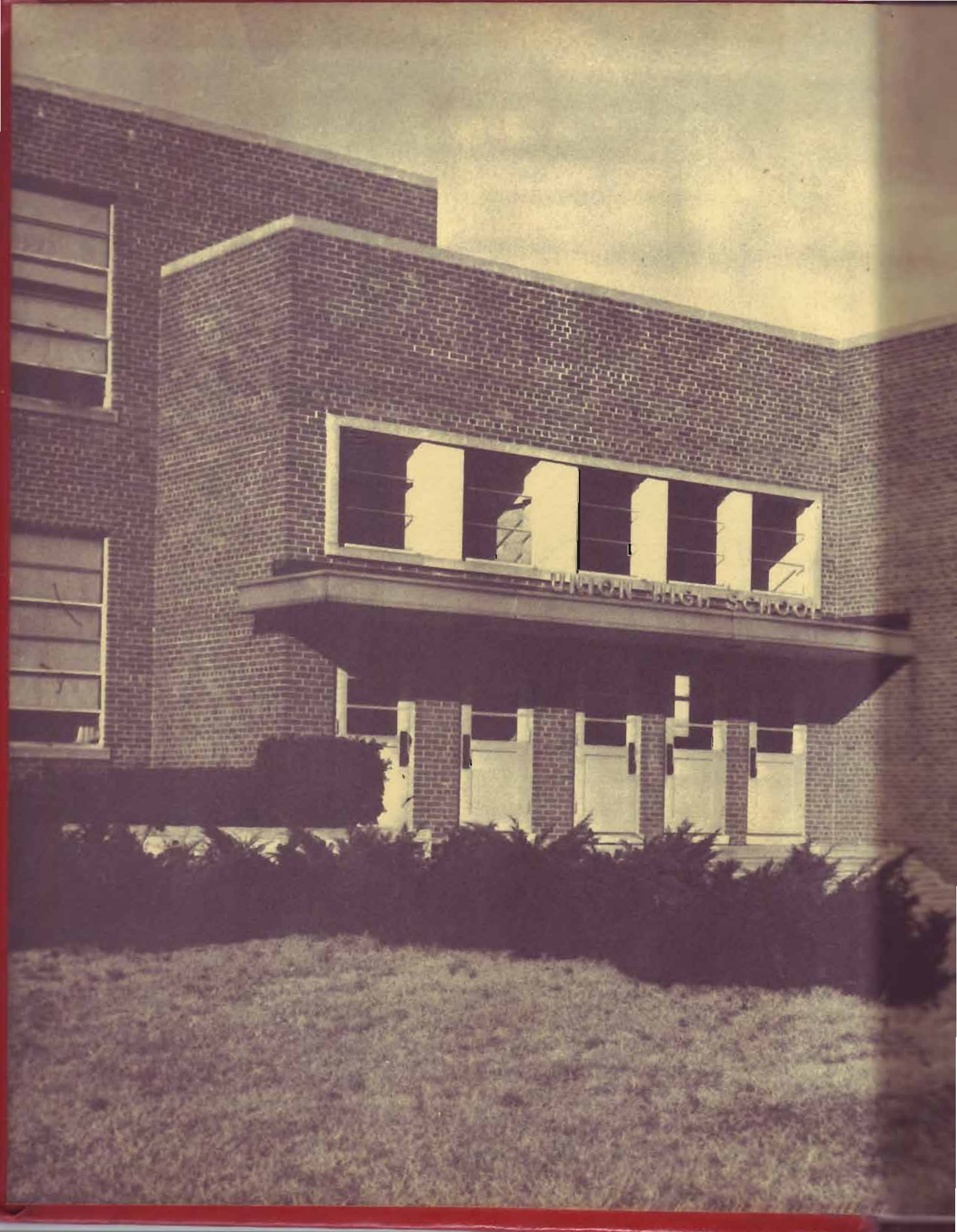

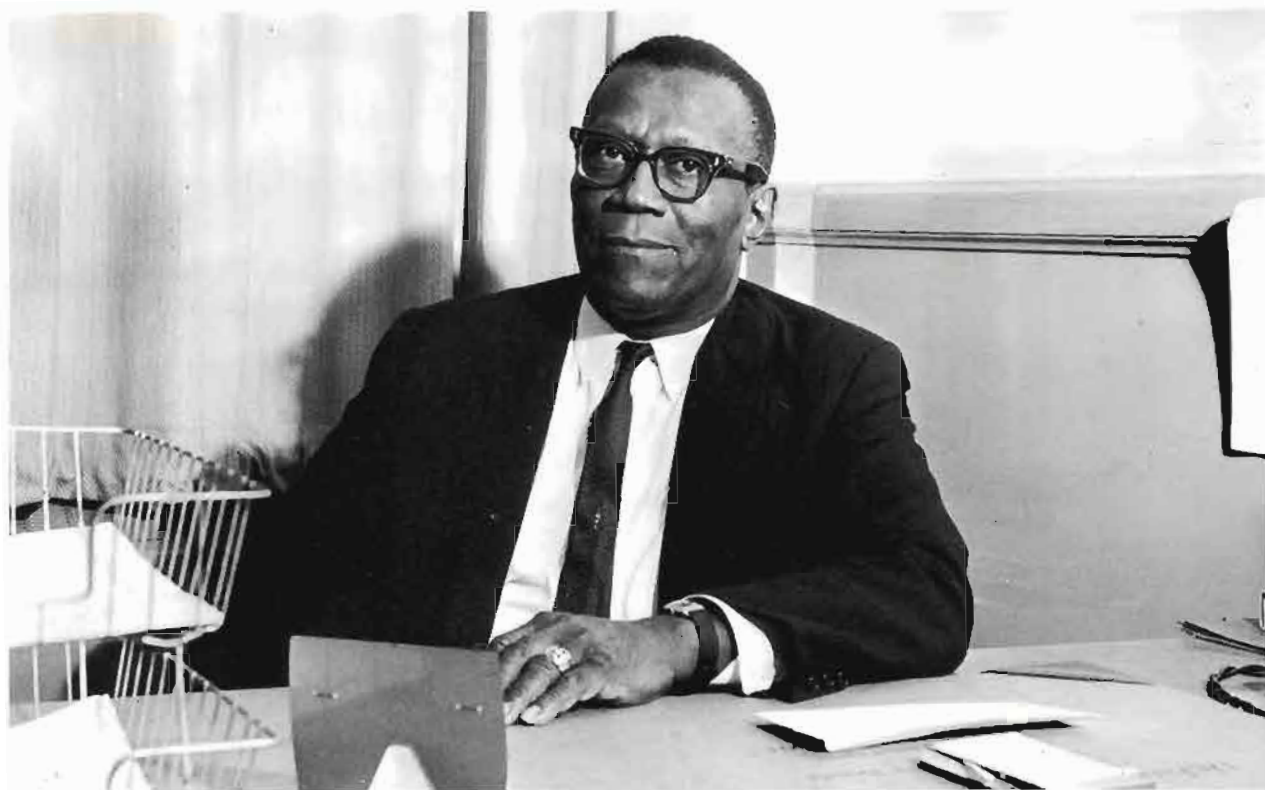
"If this gift is only the gift of humble service, do not despair -- rejoice, for this is the gift of perfect love."

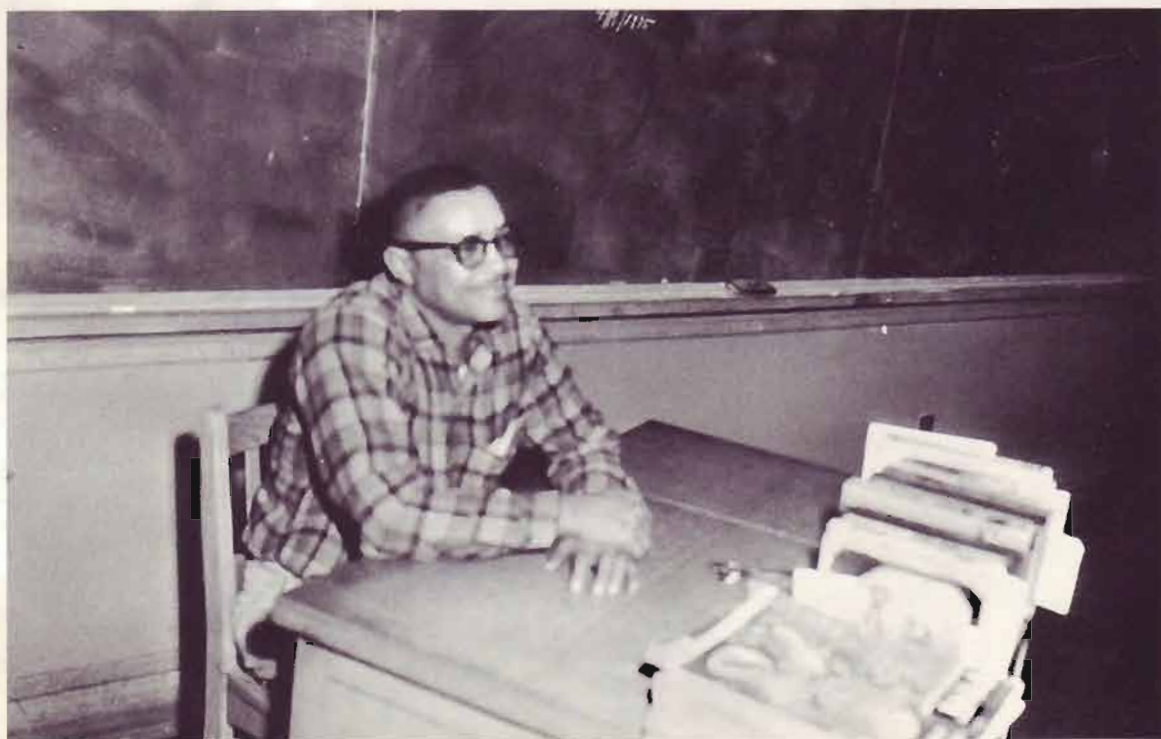

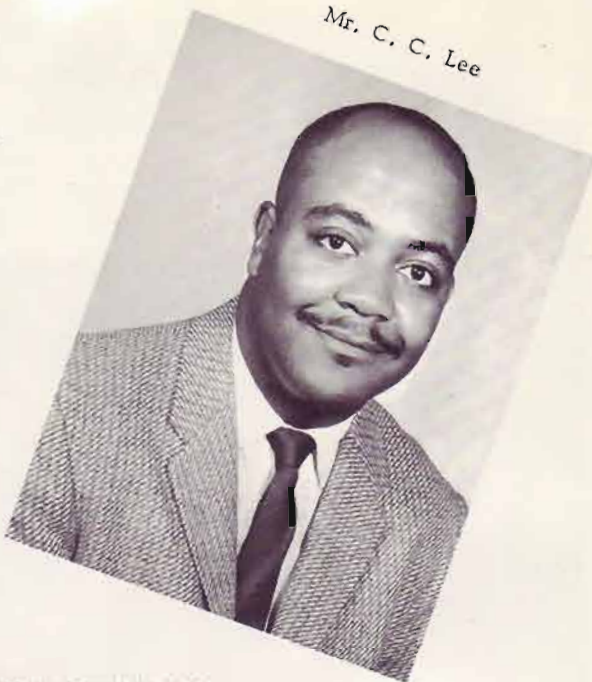

1974 -- Where Are They Now?

Last week was National Newspaper Week and I attended a luncheon given for the staff and guests of the International Association Press. It was held at the Imperial Room, a swank banquet hall in Manhattan.

As I entered the entrance hall, I immediately recognized GLADYS FITZHUGH, whom I later learned is a reporter for American Scene Magazine. Entering the crowded room, I saw in one corner, JUNE COLBERT, CAROL SMITH, GOLDIA JAMES, and CAROLYN WOOLFOLK, the nationally renowned news photographers.

PATRICIA SIZER asked Mr. Minor to contrast the foreign affairs of 1964 with those of the present.

As the discussion period came to a close, we, the audience, were informed that we were permitted to go on tours of the newspaper offices in the area during the remainder of the week.

The next day, I went to the Metropolitan Star News Building. On the elevator, I met WILBUR BAYLOR, the Chief-Photographer for the Star and he told me that MARY WINSTON was also working there as Fashion Co-ordinator. I later learned that JULIA BAYLOR is her assistant.

We noticed that the waiters, LINWOOD JAMES, THEODORE SIMMS, and NILION BATES, and the waitresses, MARY FORTUNE, GLORIA EVANS, and MARY STEWART, were all dressed in black and white uniforms representing the paper and print used for all national newspapers.

We were entertained by ALFRED GRAY, JORDAN SMITH, PHILLIP MOORE, GEORGE ROLLINS and RUBY LEE, known to the entertainment world as Ruby and the Dreamers.

When the tea was over, we were informed that the tours would continue; however, I was beginning to feel exhausted and Michael wanted to get back to his office before closing time, so after deciding to call it a day and the end of a memorable week, I asked him to take me home.
